THE GUIDELINE RULES FOR ALL CLASSES

1. An exhibit is made of fresh plant material with, or without, accessories within the space specified in the Show Schedule.
2. All exhibitors enter their exhibits at their own risk and must complete the waiver form included in the Glen Innes Show Schedule.
3. Exhibits/displays can commence from 2pm Thursday 13th Feb. 2020 until 8.00pm
4. Judging will commence at 10am on Friday 14th.
5. Exhibits/displays must be the individual work of the competitor.
6. No artificial or dried materials to be used unless specified in each class.
7. Pre-constructed or pre woven materials may be used but must not dominate the overall design.
8. Plant materials must last for the duration of the show and should be in a water source or else be replaced by the competitor.
9. Judges will be available after lunch on the Friday to discuss any awards and give constructive comments to competitors.
10. Junior classes will have the opportunity to have a discussion with the Judge. Should the Judge not be available, then the Head Steward will pass on any helpful hints relayed by the Judge to the competitors.

SENIOR CLASSES

CLASS 1 "MY HANGING GARDEN" – A suspension to be hung from a supplied wooden frame

The frame will have a drop size of 109cms with a 40cm width for each design. Zip ties or wire will be used to hang each entry. Your hanging garden can be of foliage only or a combination of plants, flowers and Foliage.

CLASS 2 “AN UNUSUAL WALL HANGING”

A traditional or modern design using a combination of fresh and dried leaves with fruit. These will be hung from the wall max. length 60cms X 60cms wide.

A design to incorporate some glass or mirrors. This can be traditional or modern.

JUNIOR CLASSES
OVERALL THEME – GARDEN FANTASIES

CLASS 9 “LANDSCAPE OF THE IMAGINATION”

This will be a group created exhibit to be staged on a 1mt X 1mt board. Height unlimited but must not extend over the 1mt base area.

Any combination of dried and fresh plant materials can be used. **A Fantasy Feature** in each design to highlight a brightly decorated garden hat – old or new. The group can incorporate glass, plastic or metal objects.

Time for staging will be after 2pm on Thursday 13th February and take-down from 12 noon on Sunday

CLASS 10 “MOTHER EARTH” for Yr 5 and Yr 6

A metal circle with diameter of approx. 30cms. A supply of plain or coloured sticks will need to be sourced. Width of sticks to be 2-3cms - not too thick. These sticks will be wrapped with different coloured sections of wool. The sticks will not be completely wrapped, but individual sections to give interest. Different coloured thick wools will give interest and colour. The sticks should be attached to the outer edges of the circle with coloured cable ties. When the circle is completely covered – neatly - the centre section should have an attachment of a cluster of gum nuts or pinecones. These could be attached by wool to the back of the completed circle.

CLASS11 “DRY CLAY CREATIVE DESIGN” for Yr 3 and Yr 4

A landscape scene will be created with the clay to shape hills, valleys and dam areas into a scene. Dried roots, skeletonized tree like shapes, some rusty wire, old man’s beard, old bits of rope. A rusty tank stand or similar for effect.
