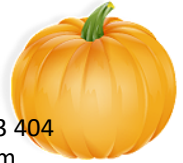

Must be true to type and correctly labelled. At least eight (8) varieties to be shown. Two (2) specimens of each variety to be shown. This display may include marrow, squash, gramma and cucumbers, watermelons and rockmelons.

2. Best Display of Vegetables by Bona-fide Home Gardener

Market Gardeners are excluded from this class. Not less than ten (10) varieties and two (2) specimens of each variety to be shown. This display may include all vegetables including pumpkins, melons, peas (500gm) and beans (500gm).

3. Best Display of Vegetables—Juniors 16 years & under

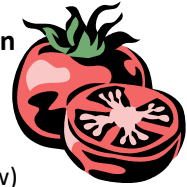
