THE GUIDELINE RULES FOR ALL CLASSES

1. An exhibit is made of fresh plant material with, or without, accessories within the space specified in the Show Schedule.
2. All exhibitors enter their exhibits at their own risk and must complete the waiver form included in the Glen Innes Show Schedule.
3. Exhibits/displays can commence from 2pm Thursday 10th February 2022 until 8.00pm
4. Judging will commence at 10am on Friday 11th.
5. Exhibits/displays must be the individual work of the competitor.
6. No artificial or dried materials to be used unless specified in each class.
7. Pre-constructed or pre woven materials may be used but must not dominate the overall design.
8. Plant materials must last for the duration of the show and should be in a water source or else be replaced by the competitor.
9. Judges will be available after lunch on the Friday to discuss any awards and give constructive comments to competitors.
10. Junior classes will have the opportunity to have a discussion with the Judge. Should the Judge not be available, then the Head Steward will pass on any helpful hints relayed by the Judge to the competitors.

unless otherwise stated in the schedule.

Please advise a steward of an entry for this class so that boards can be made available.
1 mtr boards will be provided if notified.
Dismantle time for exhibits will be 12 noon on Sunday 14th February.

SENIOR CLASSES

CLASS 1 "A FLICKER OF FLAMES" – A suspension to be hung from a supplied wooden frame

The frame will have a drop size of 109cms with a width of 75cm. The frame will be staged on the floor of the Pavilion. The design may extend beyond the outer edge of the frame top or width. Zip ties or wire can be used to hang your design from the top bar of the frame. Fresh materials should dominate in this design.

CLASS 2 "A METALIC WALL HANGING"

A traditional or modern design incorporating metal which can be rustic or shiny/painted. Any combination of dried or fresh botanical materials. These will be hung by the Stewards Max. size - 60cms X 60cms wide.

A contemporary design using both colours. **Black** should be the dominant colour.

Stage an exhibit maximum size 60cm. Feature wool and any shearing equipment. This will be staged on a table.

JUNIOR CLASSES

OVERALL THEME – “RESTORE WITH COLOUR”

CLASS 9 “A GARDEN FOLLY”

This will be a group created exhibit to be staged on a 1mt X 1mt board. Height unlimited but must not extend over the edge of the board.

Create a figure using old jeans. Stuff the legs with hay/straw/wool or newspaper. Once securely and firmly stuffed the jeans can be either seated on an old stool or chair or standing with some form of support. The waist/pant section of the jeans must remain open in order to hold a container or a bucket. This should be secured tightly within the top section with thick string, and the bucket should have some floral foam bricks as well as water. A selection of fresh garden materials should fill the bucket. To finish the Folly, you must incorporate two old painted boots plus socks into the base of the jean legs which will then complete, and create, a colourful structure. Time for staging will be after 2pm on Thursday 11th February and take down from 12 noon on Sunday 14th

CLASS 10 “WRAPPING and TIEING” for Yr 5 and Yr 6

Gather a selection of approximately 25 equally sized, similar sticks 20cms in length
A board - any colour sized 40cm length x 30cm wide. Board thin plywood or thick strong cardboard. A selection of coloured wires/wool or string. Each stick to be securely wrapped with your choice of colours. The ends must be glued to make sure that they do not come apart. The wrapped sticks will form a straight line from top to bottom glued onto the board.

To finish the design, select either silver/gold wire to twist into a curled shape to overlay the whole stick panel from top to bottom. Some small dried leaves/nuts/dried flowers or cones should be glued down the length of the curled wire to give rhythm. This will not be suspended.

CLASS11 “BOTANICAL SUNSHINE PICTURE” for Yr 3 and Yr 4

1 Laminating Pouch Outline a shape within one sheet using small light weight leaves and one small flat head of a dried flower. Some double-sided tape will help to secure your materials to the sheet. Carefully close the pouch together over the design and then laminate. Once you have laminated the pouch then you can cut out a circular shape, square or rectangle. A hole will be punched into the laminated picture and the stewards will suspend this picture for display

CLASS 12 "DRIFTWOOD DINOSAUR" for Yr 1 and Yr 2

Select a piece of driftwood no larger than 40cm. Select some found and non-plant materials to shape your Dinosaur which should sit on the top of your driftwood.

CLASS 13 "MAKE A JELLYFISH" Kindergarten

You will require 1 upturned bamboo plate which you can paint any colour on both the top and underside of the plate. Punch 1 hole through the centre of the top side. Pull through a 30cm. length of string upwards, and then glue a knotted section to the underside of the plate. This will suspend the jellyfish for hanging by the stewards. Select a bunch of multi coloured string/curling ribbon or wool approx. 30cm in length. Glue/sticky tape selections of the different coloured string to areas of the underside of the plate. These will create and look like tentacles of the jellyfish.
