Conditions of entry

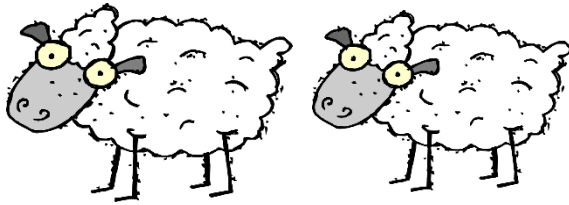
- Articles are not to have been exhibited at a previous Glen Innes Show
- Exhibits must conform to weight and length where stated
- Exhibits must be entirely the work of the exhibitor
- All garments must be as new ie unworn
- Woven articles except for tapestry weaves and floor rugs must be washed as part of the finishing process
- Where articles are made up, the finishing process is judged
- Skeins to be tied with the same yarn as the skein.
- All spinning entries are to include a staple of the fleece and the intended use of the yarn
- All skeins must weigh 25 grams or more
- A novice is a person who has never entered in their specific class of the Glen Innes Show before

Spinning – Open Section

1. Handspun article, knitted or crocheted for an adult
 2. Handspun article, knitted or crocheted for a child
 3. Handspun scarf - any fibre
 4. Skein of handspun plied wool
 5. Skein of handspun plied alpaca
 6. Skein of handspun mixed fibres – natural fibres only
 7. Skein of handspun mixed fibres – natural and man- made fibres
 8. Skein of Novelty plied fibres eg. Navaho style, Art yarn
 9. Any other article of handspun fibre
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10. 2 skeins of handspun fibre - dyed with natural dyes. State materials and mordant used.
 11. 2 skeins of handspun fibre - dyed with different commercial dyes. State materials and dyes used
 12. Any other article of handspun fibre by a spinner over 70 years
 13. Any other article of handspun fibre by a spinner over 80 years
 14. Any handspun article by a novice
 15. Skein of yarn prepared and handspun from raw fleece, include a staple of the fleece.

Spinning and Weaving – Junior Section (u/18 yrs)

16. Any handspun or hand woven article knitted or crocheted by a person under 18 yrs
17. Skein of handspun fibres, include a staple of the fleece or fibres



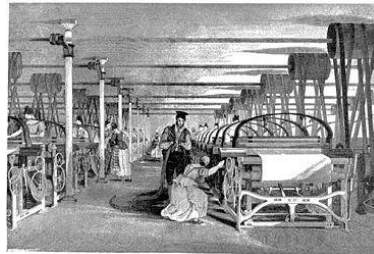
Weaving – Open Section

18. Hand woven scarf - any fibre
19. Hand woven stole or shawl any fibre
20. Handspun, hand woven any article
21. Any article hand woven by a novice
22. Any felted article
23. Any felted article by a novice
24. Any other article not mentioned
25. Any other article woven by a weaver over 70 years
26. Any other article woven by a weaver over 80 years
